Read the passage and answer the questions 28 to 30.

India has the highest number of malnourished children in the world, with Madhya Pradesh being the worst affected state.

About 47% of children under five in the country, totalling 57 million, are underweight. Even sub-Saharan Africa is better off, with 33% of children malnourished.

These shocking figures have been mentioned in UNICEF's 'Progress for Children: A Report Card on Nutrition'.

The other badly affected states in India are Uttar Pradesh, Rajasthan, Orissa, Bihar and Maharashtra. Over 50% children in some of these states are malnourished. However, some Indian states have better report cards. Malnourishment among children is significantly low in Goa, Kerala, Mizoram and Tamil Nadu.

According to Dr. Werner Schultink, UNICEF India's chief of child development and nutrition programme, the causes for this malnutrition are many: bad quality feeding, high population density, high rate of infectious diseases, high rate of illiteracy among women, gender inequality, low rate of immunization and high rate of birth of underweight babies.
